Jon McGowan, 5 North 17th Avenue, # 409, Jacksonville Beach, spoke as a member of the Duval County Election Advisory Panel and stated that due to the conditions of the Senior Center, Precinct 1309, located at 2004 Forest Avenue, would be moved to Christ United Methodist Church, 400 Penman Road, Neptune Beach.
