CITY MANAGER REPORT

City Manager Report City Manager Andy Hyatt reported the following:

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Land Use and Parks

Committee Chairman Diamond reported that his committee met on Wednesday, November 7, 2018 and discussed changing the penalties for dogs running at large on the beach. That proposed ordinance is on the agenda for tonight.

Strategic Planning and Visioning Chairman Jones reported that his committee met on Wednesday, November 14, 2018. He reported that items had been grouped into buckets. Items discussed included the update of the Comprehensive Plan, Code rewrite, the roundabout study, the civic institutional zoning district and the direction would be set at the upcoming roundtable meeting on November 28, 2018.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public Comment Diana Kelly, 207 Walnut Street, Neptune Beach, spoke regarding the current lot width, code enforcement complaint confidentiality, and public parking on Walnut Street.

PROPOSED ORDINANCES

Proposed Ordinance, Chapter 6, Animals <u>Proposed Ordinance</u>: An Ordinance of the City of Neptune Beach, Florida, Amending the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 6, Animals, Article I, In General, Section 6-5, Penalties, and Providing An Effective Date

Councilor Diamond stated that there are many of the same people are allowing their dogs to run on the beach without a leash. He added that increasing the fine would give animal control the ability to stop the repeat offenders. The proposed fines are the same as Atlantic Beach.

Councilor Diamond suggested public outreach to make citizens aware of these issues.

CONTRACTS / AGREEMENTS

Draft License Agreement-2050 Kings Road South Right-of-Way Draft License Agreement for 2050 Kings Circle South

Deputy City Manager Amanda Askew explained that there are parking spaces located at this property and half of them are in the City right-of-way. In order for the spaces to be counted towards his total parking, he would need to have access. The revocable license agreement would allow the owner to use these spaces and count them towards his total.

Councilor Arthur stated he had concerns that there was no fee for use of city property.

Tom Monohan, 2050 Kings Circle S, Neptune Beach, stated it is an office building and this would give him five more spaces.

Vice Mayor Scott Wiley commented the City is leasing City property to make up the difference that is not there.

Councilor Diamond stated that there is no other value to the City property other than to this particular property.

ISSUE DEVELOPMENT

Resolution No. 2018-15, City Manager Authority Resolution No. 2018-15, A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Enter Into and Execute Any Agreement, Contract, Proposal or Other Such Binding Document for Services, as Approved or Acknowledged by the City Council

City Manager Hyatt explained this memorializes him signing agreements already approved by Council. This would potentially expedite that process. This resolution is in effect for one year and would be brought back each year for Council approval.

Speed Hump Request-Forest Marsh Drive/Indian Woods Drive Speed Hump Request--Forest Marsh Drive / Indian Woods Drive

Brittany Lane, 1425 Forest Marsh Drive, Neptune Beach, stated she had submitted the speed hump petition. Since then, a three-way stop has been added.

Police Chief Richard Pike commented that there is already a speed hump west of the new three-way stop.

Ms. Lane remarked that there is still an issue on the other side of the existing speed hump.

Councilor Jones suggested having a broader discussion regarding traffic calming. There are other types of measure that could be applied such as curb extensions, medians, and landscaping. He also commented that the current amber lighting is not a best practice and looking other types of speed deterrents should be considered.
