


Additionally, the rise in non-structural residential alteration permits, electrical, and residential alterations show a trend that small redevelopment and updating of existing structures is happening within the city.






Building Permit Monthly Comparison


Incoming Building Permit Fees



Building Permit Incoming Fees




Fire Permits Monthly Comparison


Fire/Floodplain Incoming Fees






Code Enforcement Monthly Comparison


